Cincinnati Physician, Kevin McChord, M.D., Passes Phlebology Board Certification Exam Administered by the American Board of Phlebology

- Evidence of professional standing
- Evidence of commitment to lifelong-learning and periodic self-assessment
- Evidence of cognitive expertise
- Evaluation of performance in practice

Dr. McChord is also board certified in family medicine. He received his medical degree from the Wright State University School of Medicine in Dayton, OH. He served his residency at St. Elizabeth Medical Center in Covington, KY.
